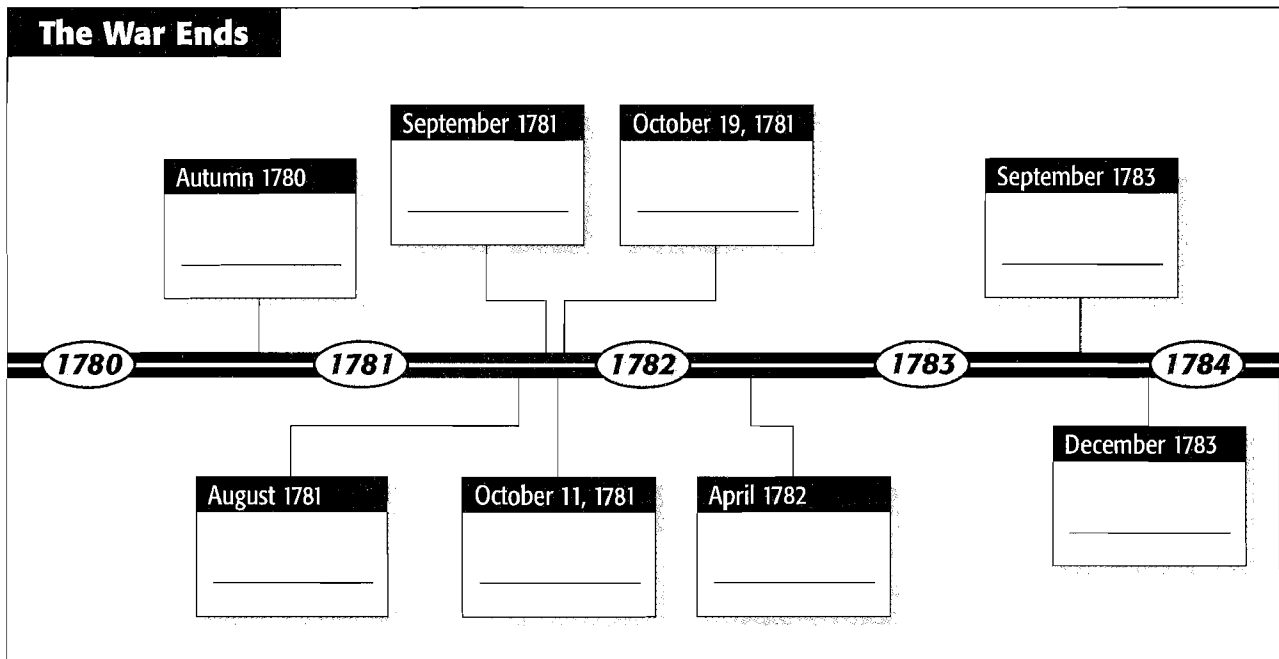

- A. 17,000 American and French troops trap Charles Cornwallis's 8,000 British and Hessian troops at Yorktown.
- B. George Washington says farewell to his troops at Fraunces' Tavern in Manhattan.
- C. After learning that Admiral François de Grasse is heading toward Chesapeake Bay, Washington secretly leads his troops south to Yorktown.
- D. Benjamin Franklin, John Adams, and John Jay represent the United States as peace talks begin in Paris.
- E. Realizing the hopelessness of the situation, Cornwallis surrenders.
- F. Washington camps north of New York City waiting for a second fleet of French ships to arrive.
- G. The Battle of Yorktown begins as the Americans and French bombard British troops.
- H. The final Treaty of Paris is signed, defining the borders of the United States and giving Americans the right to fish off the coast of Canada.
