4. How many miles would a trader from Timbuktu cover traveling to Cairo?

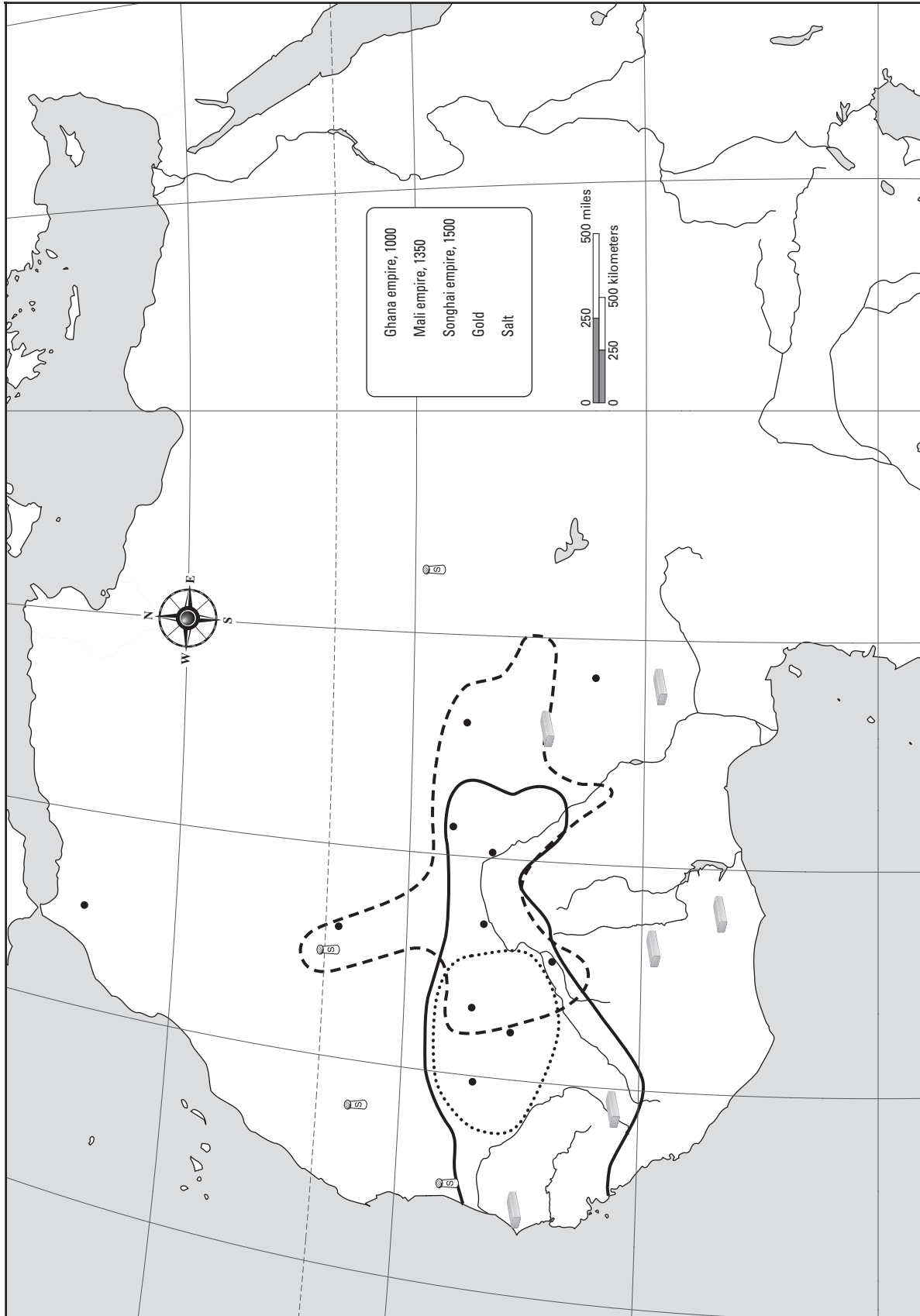
5. Which city was closest to gold and salt resources?
