Explaining geographic patterns involves understanding the movement of such things as people, cultures, or ideas across Earth. Geographic patterns include the migration of people, the growth of economic systems, and the spread of religion.

To understand the geographic pattern shown on this map, first locate and read the title. Identify the graphics on the map. Arrows often show the movement of ideas, goods, or people. Locate and study the legend so that you can interpret the graphics. Use the compass rose to determine the directions that the arrows point. Locate and use the scale to determine distance.
